Onyinye is a Nigerian Multidisciplinary artist, a member of society of Nigerian Artists(SNA) and Female Artist Association of Nigeria. She graduated from Institute of Management and Technology Enugu, Fine and Applied Arts Department with a Distinction Grade. She is an explorative artist with flair for new ideas and has shown her mastery of different medium of art; Photography, Serigraphy on tiled Perspex, exploration with light and sound which has won her the prize for **Originality** in 2014. Presently she dwells more on String art which has won her the **Overall winner** prize in 2016 "Life in My City Art Festival" and **finalist** in Visual Art Competition organised by Spanish Embassy of Nigeria, 2018 and 2019.

However, her works are born out of personal experiences in life and mostly advocates for women empowerment. They paint pictures of life situations and dynamics with a view to motivate people to a better understanding of life as well as a well fulfilled life. This new exploration with threads and nails has shown her as an artist with patience and precision. Her use of colours, interplay of different strokes of thread on delicate compositions and artistry can only leave her audience in an exquisite expectation for more.

#### **ARTIST'S STATEMENT**

My style of work is dynamic, focusing on giving voice to those who are often unheard, mostly women and children. My work begins with conceptualization. Looking at the happenings around, issues that are in the news, societal challenges and much more. I identify striking issues with which I form my images/ideas.

When I pick up my board, nails, hammer and threads to string, am well aware that my ideas, emotions, feelings and concepts formed from experience will engage a lot of mind trying to make meaning out of life. The thread I often used is timeless with an interwoven motion binding viewers to the past and present. My creation also deals on thoughts and connections using string to connect lines across time and space. The interplay of different colourful strokes of thread on nails has been used to reveal the fading culture and political issues as well.

My recent work "Becoming" depicts my personal experience in search of my dream and fulfilment in life. I used facial expressions to show through my own life's experience, that fulfilment and self realization is possible. And so we are not left helpless at the mercy of our difficulties and limitations which leads to depression and sometimes suicide. There is hope which derives from our resolve on our never giving up. "If we don't give up" states by Jack MA, "then we still have a chance".

Art remains the only way through which I share my thoughts and ideas with the aim to comfort the disturbed. My works are always laden with emotions and aesthetics.


Title of work: BLEEDING ROSE

Title of work: BECOMING



They're too young to marry. Educating girls is a necessary investment for a peaceful and poverty free world.




Title of work: LIFE

Title of work: "Amidst Her Tears"




Pain is real. Suffering is real.




**Title of work:** LOVE IS A BATTLE FIELD **Medium:** Nails & String on Board


Title of work: 'Lyrics of An African Maiden




**Title of work:** BEHIND THE MASK **Medium:** Nails & String on Board




Title of work: BEHIND CLOSED DOORS




**Title of work: '**Lyrics of An African Maiden 2' series


