

Corrado Leoni was born in Genoa in 1963.

His art-works have been exposed at the Contemporary Art Fair in Marbella, Spain and at the International Poetry Festival in Genoa (Personal painting exhibition "The wheel of rebirth").

In 2005 his painting "The Wonderland Island" has been sorted out to represent Italy at the Exhibition "Pyramide Europe, Barcelona Fair, Spain.

He realized the sketches for the hall of the ship Costa Concordia and the whole ceiling of the Jupiter Theatre for the ship Costa Serena. His painting "The Jupiter sky" has been reproduced in great size (about 60 x 60 feet) as a permanent art-work in one of the greater transatlantic of the fleet.

In 2007 his painting "Scenes from Alexandria of Egypt" has been supplied for the perimeter of the "Splendor", Carnival Ship, library, inaugurated on may, 2008

He has realized some "Units" for "Mohammed Two", the Restricted Communication Center founded by Plinio Mesciulam; the first part of the project is preserved at the Paul Getty Museum, Los Angeles.

For his exhibitions, sometimes he uses atypical places as furniture showrooms, jewelries.

He is the founder of the artistic movement "Kaleido", together with the painter Roberto Bixio; in the 90's they proposed thematic exhibitions based on metamorphosis, fantastic landscapes, in a sort of multimedia show in which the static photographic image magically turns to a pictorial art-work.

The real world lived by Leoni during his long activity of free-lance photographer (during the 80's and the 90's he realized photographic reportages for the main italian magazines all around the world) becomes a dream, bringing all that potentially lives in each picture to the extreme consequence: the capacity to catch the reality from a visual corner and to elevate it to a symbol, an icon.

In the final expression Leoni reproduces his tridimensional art-works, giving a sense to the lifeless objects as stones, scraps-iron, manholes, branches of trees, elements that have suffered the time and the transformations of nature.
